

Archery etiquette

For copyright reasons this is my version of the suggestions in the Archery GB Rules of Shooting. Please read that as well.

A thoughtful archer:

- Talks quietly when others are shooting.
- Refrains from talking to an archer who clearly wishes not to be disturbed.
- Remains quiet on the shooting line to avoid disturbing a nearby archer when shooting.
- Waits until all scores have been recorded before retrieving arrows from behind the target.
- Does not compare scores by walking along the shooting line.
- Asks permission to touch other people's equipment.
- Calls scores in groups of three, e.g. 9-9-7' wait '7-7-3'.
- Pays in cash immediately if he or she damages someone else's arrow through carelessness. This does not apply to a 'Robin Hood'.
- Says 'Thank you' to the Target Captain at the end of the round.
