## Tom's Tips: A simple glue holder

It seems that it takes a long time for the glue to get to the end of the bottle once it gets below half full — especially when it's cold. I've dealt with this for years and used to just stand and wait. I figured I'd share what I finally came up with that works great and saves a lot of time waiting for glue to get to the nozzle. I just took a scrap block of wood and drilled some holes in it. This was a really well used scrap.



I ended up with a cup holder, a place for sticks, and places to keep glues pointed down for ready use. For a photo of this specific holder with items in place, see below.

These glue holders are really very handy if you are a builder. I have a couple different "glue holders" around the shop, all made from scrap.



Design your own and make building easier — or just a bit faster.

Note: Make sure your glue tops are on tight. I don't store glue this way. I just use it when I'm working on something.
